Heavy tasking to bylaw/traffic from Ottawa Police at this time to help mitigate keeping emergency lanes open. ATV/Snowmobile convoy coming from the East. 1000 Vehicles spotted on 416 arriving imminently.

Mac Cartier bridge will reopen for traffic once convoy parks to allow employees/hospital workers to get to work. Many road closures in effect. Crowd agitated but no acts of violence to report. Isolated barrel fires being managed as needed by Ottawa Fire.

Some extremist trying to create a mob mentality in the crowd and threatening to ram the Parliament gates. Increased agitation observed in the crowd but remains verbal at this time with officers. Paramedics required police for security due to the crowd being agitated with them as well (not specifying who they are targeting in uniform). Highest crowd estimate right on the hill was 8,000.

support two incidents between 9:00pm and 10:00pm (request from OPS to remove wooden pallets at Wellington & Metcalfe; request for Special Constables to attend the Williams/Rideau Transit Station for minor property damage following a physical altercation). There were initial reports of 20-30 suspected Antifa members mobilizing near Wellington & Metcalfe at approximately 9:45pm, with reports that a coordinated event may take place at approximately 10:00pm. OPS and PPS staff monitored all activity closely, and no events/risks materialized.

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There were also reports of homeless individuals beginning to set up an encampment at the Williams/Rideau Transit Station. The EOC Human Needs Section was notified accordingly.

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Protestor volumes reduced considerably by 11:30pm, and by 1:00am - there was no one on Parliament Hill, and minimal pedestrian traffic on Wellington and throughout the downtown core.

[2022-01-31, 8:15:55 AM] Kelly Cochrane: Morning. Still waiting on our sit rep here at NCRCC. Most notable event last night was a demonstrator posing as a police official approaching a fleet vehicle requesting diesel fuel for their "RCMP vehicle". Fleet flagged the request right away and it was denied.

[2022-01-31, 8:16:09 AM] Kelly Cochrane: they are getting creative in trying to re-fuel their trucks

[2022-01-31, 10:14:15 AM] Kelly Cochrane: PM expected to make an announcement today at 11:15. No significant changes in operations at this point. Saw some demonstrators/vehicles leave the City last night. Police are continuing to hold the perimeter and now allow any vehicles into those vacant spots. This is a point of contention with the BC Group.

[2022-01-31, 10:27:28 AM] Kelly Cochrane: Update: A 1 ton truck has hit a police cruiser at Rideau and Sussex and a group walking downtown on O'Connor with wooden pallets. Concerned they will be set on fire. Environment appears more hostile in the last 30 minutes

[2022-01-31, 10:29:46 AM] Steve Kanelakos: Keep us posted

[2022-01-31, 10:31:35 AM] Kelly Cochrane: Will do. They do have gas cans. Fire also notified

[2022-01-31, 11:57:23 AM] Kelly Cochrane: Update: Parliament hill numbers remain low (approx 20-25). Multiple MPs at Parliament and another group expecting to walk there from across the street shortly (with escort). On-going investigation into the truck that hit the cruiser but the driver has been detained. Rideau and Sussex remains a flashpoint with agitators there. Reports of Convoys gathering from the states with intentions to head this way (none confirmed en route). Police reporting significant alcohol consumption in the crowd that is present.

The main issues right now are trying to figure out how to free up the fleet vehicles as they are needed long-term in the city, particularly if this storm arrives on Wednesday.

NCRCC Threat Level remains at medium. There were isolated traffic management issues last night, including trucks moving closer to the perimeter at Rideau and Sussex, and vehicles refusing to move for OPS at Kent & Queen and Kent & Albert (indicating they would only move for paramedics or fire). Traffic at checkpoints continues to be a pain point that OPS is actively managing.

Preparations are actively underway in anticipation of a larger presence downtown over the weekend. Updates from policing agencies indicate there are additional convoys expected from Quebec City, two from Eastern Ontario, and one from Kingston; however, no details on size or timing have been confirmed. Intel also indicates that applications have been received for counter-protestors on February 5 from noon to 7pm (expecting 1,000 protestors); two additional smaller protests of 100 people each are expected at 474 Elgin (OPS HQ) over the weekend. No intel is available re: any events planned at Confederation Park; I will continue to monitor and will keep everyone posted.

There are minimal individuals on the Hill at this time. The House is expected to sit from 10am to no later than 7pm. PPS is continuing to review its posture. PPS has also advised that the cenotaph is expected to be gated/fenced off over the weekend, based on last weekendâ€™s incidents. This is being coordinated by the Feds.

Our next NCRCC SitRep is at 11:30am, so I hope to share more information shortly after that.

[2022-02-03, 11:46:17 AM] Todd Piper: NCRCC Update: The 11:30am SitRep was extremely short. Intel advised that there continue to be threats on social media against PM Trudeau, including threats to drive up to Harrington Lake. There was also confusion about a potential protest at 474 Elgin (OPS HQ) today, however â€" Intel advised that they are only aware of protests on February 5. Beyond that, we were advised that the NCRCC will remain activated 24/7 until at least February 14.

On the City front, discussions continue with OPS about the traffic management plan, and I hope to have more to share later. We are actively working on a number of requests at

the moment, including: BLRS staff being threatened at 195 Kent St. by individuals with blacked-out license plates (OPS attending), a sewer issue near Wellington and Elgin requiring staff to attend the site, and a request from the NCC for support installing snow-packed planters at several locations on the west-side of the core (e.g., Wellington Street and Commissioner St.)

She is planning to burn a Canada flag, and there are individuals in the crowd indicating that they won't allow that to happen. The situation is at risk of escalating, but PPS is nearby and monitoring closely. The number of individuals nearby remains low.

OPS Intel has indicated that diesel fuel and other supplies are being stockpiled at Confederation Park; OPS and OFS are actively looking at regulatory violations to address this. OPS is also indicating that there are a large number of smaller convoys (10 - 20 vehicles per convoy) that are increasing traffic congestion and pushing the perimeter further south.

There was a miscommunication earlier about protection measures that would be in place at the Cenotaph over the weekend. We were originally under the impression that the Feds were going to be installing gates/fencing, however - they were merely indicating that they have this capability, if requested. Beth and I are currently confirming the process for formally submitting that request, and we hope to have a clear path forward shortly.

The next NCRCC SitRep is scheduled for 5:00pm.

[2022-02-03, 4:18:40 PM] Todd Piper: NCRCC Update: Regarding the diesel fuel and propane stockpile at Confederation Park, it is now being widely reported that a wooden structure is being built on Lawrence Freiman Lane (QED) between the Laurier Avenue Bridge and the NAC. I have been in discussions with the NCC to ask that they send a Conservative Officer (accompanied by an OPS PLT member) to formally request that they dismantle the structure and leave. Based on the response from the group, next steps will be determined by the OPS team here at the NCRCC.

[2022-02-03, 8:23:55 PM] Todd Piper: NCRCC Update: As most of you are already aware, the wooden structure and on-site fuel continue to be the most active issue for us right now. While it was originally reported that the fuel had been voluntarily removed from the site, it turns out that the fuel was either returned to the site afterwards, or was hidden when NCC staff visited the site. Since then, OPS staff have visited the site, and the protestors have confirmed that the diesel is being loaded into the back of pickup trucks for distribution, and the propane will be removed in a cube van (I believe). OPS are maintaining a presence to ensure this actually happens.

The approach for the wooden structure continues to be a question mark. While no

official decision has been made by the Incident Commander (Inspector Isabelle Lemieux), the preliminary recommendation from her Officers is to not proceed with removing the structure at this time. It goes without saying that there are a number of political and public confidence risks with that recommendation that I have shared with OPS. Nonetheless, I suspect further conversations will be needed with City senior management, the Chief, and the Mayor in the early hours tomorrow to finalize the path forward.

We've confirmed with both By-Law and police and yes... companies are refusing to tow transport trucks. Only passenger vehicles. This puts the companies in breach of contract with the City, as we have arrangements for 24/7 towing, including of heavy vehicles. This is happening in other parts of the country too. The CEO of Inter-Pacific wrote to the RCMP to formally refuse towing services related to any convoy/protest.

Drivers are saying they will lock up the brakes (basically sabotage their vehicles). It's fixable but replacing an air tank would turn each drive into a 5-hour endeavour. Police are still working on their legal authority to seize the vehicles... they are not sure where they are driving the trucks to... and they are worried about officer safety.



fuel in the red zone (12 jerricans seized in the past 30-minutes). OPS staff in the NCRCC are not aware of any arrests from overnight operations (beyond the seven reported in OPS' MR). As Kelly indicated in her last update, three BLRS staff are meeting with OPS QRT this morning to resume enforcement activities for the day.

[2022-02-07, 9:19:18 AM] Todd Piper: We just had our 9am SitRep. No major updates beyond what I've highlighted above. The House is sitting from 11am to 7pm; six scheduled Committees; Senate is back and sitting tomorrow. City Hall remains a staging area for RCMP VIP detail. PM is back at Rideau Cottage. There are also now intel reports of truckers using BitCoin to fund their operations (\$300K in one wallet; unknown funds spread out in other wallets). Next SitRep here is planned for 11am.

[2022-02-07, 10:14:23 AM] Todd Piper: NCRCC Update: Unfortunately, OPS is now advising that they're short bodies and they haven't been able to mobilize enough Officers for QRT to integrate with BLRS staff. OPS is supposed to keep me updated on Officer availability to resume these coordinated efforts, but I will be sure to stay on them so this doesn't fall of their radar.

[2022-02-07, 12:12:58 PM] Todd Piper: IMPORTANT - NCRCC Update: A recent up discussion with OPS in the room here has painted a less-than-optimistic outlook for today and the near-term. OPS continues to assert that their resources are depleted, and that the 250 Officers announced the other day from partner agencies are still in the process of being mobilized and are not available. As such, there were talks of smaller scale enforcement, with Officers being instructed to let supplies through if a crowd begins to gather while it is happening (images of low quantities of supplies being delivered this morning have already started to circulate on social media). Since then, Iâ€™ve just learned that OPS will be stopping all confiscation of jerricans into the red zone, as â€” in addition to their resource challenges - protestors are now filling them with water, drinking from them, and challenging Officers on their authority to collect. As such, I am understandably concerned that we are going to lose the positive momentum we started to see last night/early this morning through network media and social media, and that political and public confidence is going to further deteriorate with OPSâ€™ new posture detailed above.

The 11am SitRep was very quick and didn't offer any notable updates. The only relevant piece of intel is that there has been a social media post starting to circulate calling for a counter-protest at City Hall between Feb. 9 â€” Feb. 28 calling for the resignation of Chair Deans, Councillor Meehan, Chief Sloly, and Mayor Watson. The details are very high-level and unconfirmed at this point, so it is more of a watch-item for the group. Our next SitRep here is 2pm.


